### Some definitions

#### **Social Care Institute for Excellence**

'The term 'co-production' describes working in partnership by sharing power between people who draw on care and support, carers, families and citizens.'

#### **Co-production Network for Wales**

'In a nutshell, co-production is when professionals work in partnership with people who have lived experience, to develop solutions to challenges in public services and communities.'

#### **NHS England/The Coalition for Personalised Care**

'A way of working that involves people who use health and care services, carers and communities in equal partnership; and which engages groups of people at the earliest stages of service design, development and evaluation.'
